A wonderful riot of constant activity! The animals come from adoptions, shelters, and "drop-offs" – the Bartons obviously have big hearts.

On two Saturdays in early September, the Barton kids and two of their pals staffed a lemonade stand at a well-travelled corner near their home. The budding entrepreneurs pulled in an amazing \$230 which they donated to FFN.

### DID YOU KNOW?

For the past several years, FFN has celebrated Alley Cat Allies' "National Feral Cat Day" on 16 October by drawing the winners of our wine raffle. This year, we're excited to report that since the inception of "National Feral Cat Day" in 2001, more and more organizations in more and more countries have become involved in education about community cats and the promotion of Trap/Neuter/Return (TNR).

In recognition, "National Feral Cat Day" has now officially become "Global Cat Day" and FFN will celebrate community cats by giving away a clowder\* of eartipped\* chocolate community cats to three lucky winners.

To enter the draw, shop at Feed-All, Global Pet Food, or the Pet Valu stores in Stratford during the week before Global Cat Day. The winners will be drawn on 16 October 2017, Global Cat Day itself.

\*Wondering what "clowder" and "eartip" mean? A clowder is actually the correct name for a group of cats, while an eartip is the universal sign of an altered feral cat – a quarter of an inch is removed from the tip of the left ear during spay/neuter surgery. This does not hurt the cat and makes it possible to see that the cat in question has been cared for through TNR. The chocolate cat prizes in FFN's Global Cat Day draw will all be eartipped!
