


Kazoo's story



Kaz, or Kazoo, is a pretty amazing girl. She was found in the country hobbling around on a severely injured leg. We were alerted to her by one of our TLC volunteers, Jes K., and she was quickly brought into our care. Kaz had multiple vet visits and it was hoped she would recover enough to save the leg, but that wasn't in the cards. Kaz had a severe bone infection and after numerous rounds of antibiotics and no improvement, the difficult decision to have the leg amputated had to be made. The surgery was a success thanks to the skill of our partnering vets. Her recovery was smooth except for a few small bumps along the way including an emergency visit. The foster fit her into a surgical suit of sorts and that seemed to do trick. We can't imagine the pain and suffering she endured when alone, but thanks to our donors, volunteers and supporters, she is now living a pain-free, happy life.


Shelter builders needed

Annual General Meeting - a summary

Our second virtual AGM was held on Sunday, 27
February. 2021 was our second year operating during a pandemic, and some of the same challenges continued, such as delayed and postponed vet appointments. The widespread shortage of veterinarians and continued Covid complications have resulted in a backlog of appointments for some of the clinics we work with. For Feline Friends, difficulty getting spay & neuter appointments means that we cannot move cats through our programs as quickly as usual. Given that we have limited foster spaces, it reduces the number of cats we are able to take in.

2021 FINANCIALS

• Total revenue: \$102,485

• Total expenditures: \$77,052

Excess of revenue over expenditures: \$25,433

TRAP-NEUTER-RETURN (TNR)

AND FOSTER & ADOPTION

- 120 cats in adoption program
- 19 cats in TNR program
- total of 139 cats (decrease of 54 from 2020)
- 56 of those cats were strays/abandoned cats found in Stratford (increase of 1 from 2020)
- increase in senior cats
- increase of cats requiring emergency medical care

LOW-INCOME SPAY/NEUTER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

• Low-Income Spay/Neuter Assistance numbers rebounded last year as compared to 2020, but are still below pre-pandemic levels as follows: 99 vouchers issued for the spay or neuter of 117 cats in 2021 (20 more vouchers issued than in 2020, but still 26 fewer than in 2019)
